

## St Mary of the Angels Pupil Premium; how we spent it and what were the outcomes; end of academic year 2018/19.

Our latest OFSTED report published in July 2017 judged that ;

*“The pupil premium funding for disadvantaged pupils is being used effectively. Information on the current progress being made by this group of pupils shows that the difference between them and others nationally with similar starting points is diminishing.”*

In 2018-19, Pupil Premium Grant was spent in diverse ways – all aimed at supporting each child in raising achievement, self esteem and attainment.

Key areas were;

- \*Small group academic interventions, such as inference training in KS2
- \*Individual academic interventions, such as Every Child a Reader support, ‘Power of Two’ Maths etc
- \*Individual mental health and pastoral work (eg Emotional Literacy Support Assistant, enabling counselling, bereavement strategies, anger management etc)
- \*Purchase of educational support equipment, to enable better curriculum access (eg Times Tables Rock Stars and I.D. L. dyslexia software, for daily use; physical aids – disability chairs, writing slopes, personal care access aids etc)
- \*Support with full cost of educational enrichment opportunities (eg Kingswood camp, Spanish exchange to Pamplona, Boat Museum History day etc)
- \*Full engagement in learning and school life, despite poverty challenges (eg free access to breakfast club, free school uniform vouchers etc) so that all pupils are fit and ready for school work daily
- \*Support with the costs of extra curricular activities and other enrichment, which will benefit pupils’ mental health and behaviour for learning

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In terms of outcomes, **green** scores show pupils attaining in line with, or above, national expectations in 2019 summer tests and assessments. The boxes below will demonstrate whether school is closing the gap for the pupil premium group. We believe that we are, and we will not become complacent in doing so.

**Green** scores show pupils attaining in line with, or above, national expectations in 2019 summer tests and assessments.
