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Raising Standards In Our School

Each year the Governing Body is responsible for reviewing our school performance data and holding our school leaders to account for results achieved. Have you ever wondered how we do this?

What is RAISEonline?

A secure web-based system that provides schools, local authorities and inspectors with a range of analyses including:

- Attainment in the age 6 phonics check and at the end of Key Stages 1 and 2 (KS1 and KS2)
- Pupil progress from KS1 to KS2
- Performance of different pupils groups and subjects within a school
- Absence and exclusions
- The characteristics (often referred to as 'context') of pupils.

For each type of analysis our school is compared to national averages for primary schools.

What is it for?

It is an important (but not the only) source of data for school governors to use in retrospective self-evaluation and school improvement planning. We use it alongside other sources of data such as the Ofsted Data Dashboard, FFT Governor Dashboard, FFT Self Evaluation Booklet and the schools' own pupil tracking data. The analyses are used by Ofsted

inspectors during inspections of schools. It is therefore critical that we are able to interpret our school's data from an inspector's perspective and are able to identify any areas of under-performance in order to explain why they occurred; or demonstrate that we recognise them and have set out the action we are taking to address them.

How governors use RAISE-online?

Both Ofsted and the Department for Education have made it clear in recent years that school governors play a pivotal role in providing support and challenge to school leaders. To do this effectively, our governors have access to good quality, timely data from the headteacher enabling us to ask challenging questions and get the answers we need.

Ofsted evaluate how well governors hold the headteacher and senior staff to account for the achievement of pupils. We work hard to ensure that we understand the available data and the strengths and weaknesses of our school.

So how is our School Performing?

The overall performance is excellent. In KSI, (all subjects) results exceed the national average for expected levels at KSI. In all subject areas, we have seen a significant improvement in results over the last 3 years. Writing continues to be a whole school focus, with a view to achieving a higher number of L3 writers. (ie. exceed what is nationally expected for Y2 pupils). KS2 results across the board are above national average.

Progress between KSI and KS2 has increased consistently over the last three years. This period has seen the introduction of the schools own curriculum plans in numeracy and assessment and a more consistent assessment approach across the school.

Attendance this year has been exceptional and is way above national average.

We are fortunate to have such committed and skilled teaching & support staff. On behalf of the Governing body I thank them for their continued hard work with all of our children,

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Safeguarding and Child Protection

Safeguarding and protecting our children in school is a top priority and as such, we carry out a regular review of our policy in line with National guidance and Legislation.

Pupil Progress

Following on from the fantastic review we had from our school improvement partner, we continue to monitor the progress of our pupils.

Each week the whole staff team meet to discuss pupil progress across the school. Our teachers use this opportunity to share ideas and learn from each other. This exercise has proved to be very beneficial and it is intended that this practice will continue as it benefits of all our children.

I am a Chartered Public Finance Accountant in the public sector. As a School Governor, I am the Chair of the Finance and Personnel Committee.

The committee looks after the resources of our School, in relation to money and people. We work closely with the Headteacher, the School Business Manager and the Full Governing Body to ensure our school continues to have a

strong financial footing to support our children. The committee also monitors our schools performance and sets targets for the Headteacher for the year ahead, so that we continue to aim for the best outcomes for all of our pupils.

As part of the budget process we continuously review the spend for the current year, as well as projections for the next few years.

We are looking at continuing the improvements to the outdoor areas of the school, as well as investing in new technology for use by the children (such as i-pads).

School Building Fund: Helping Your Child's School

Did you know that Catholic schools have to pay for the ownership, building, repair and maintenance of their own schools?

County schools don't have this responsibility. Plus, on average, Catholic schools receive approximately £500 less per pupil in state funding, yet still manage to spend more per pupil than many county schools. How do we manage this? Well that's a good question. First of all, by very prudent stewardship of all the available finances and, secondly, by the support of the Diocese of Shrewsbury, through the School Building Fund.

The School Building Fund was established by the Diocese as a means to help support all Catholic schools. St. Mary of the Angels in particular has benefitted greatly in recent years from the fund; the most obvious example being our beautiful, modern and well maintained school, which provides a wonderful learning environment for our children and is the envy of many other primary schools. Without this Building Fund support, the school governors would have had to take a massive

loan for our liability for our new building – which would have meant considerably less teaching assistant support and certainly less resources. The support of the fund is a vital component in the financial make-up of the school; and it is therefore imperative for the future wellbeing of our Catholic schools and pupils that the Fund's income stream be maintained. Parental contributions are a very important part of the Fund's income. However, in recent years there has been a decrease in the number of parents making the annual contribution; and this obviously has a negative effect on the fund and its ability to render support to schools at the desired

levels. In these times of austerity, it is understandable when families are experiencing pressures on their finances but just consider this; an annual contribution of say £15.00 works out at about 28p a day - not much really when you consider the benefits to your child's education. We would strongly encourage all parents to do their best to make this small annual contribution to the Diocesan School Building Fund. Please help us to maintain the high quality of education and facilities that all our children deserve both now and in the future. Thank you.
